Assurances

6. If the District/PSA determines that it is safe to provide in-person instruction to pupils , the District/PSA will prioritize providing in-person instruction to pupils in grades K to 5 who are enrolled in the District/PSA.
7. The District/PSA assures that
 - o instruction will be delivered as described in this plan and re-confirmed by the District/PSA Board,
 - o the description of instructional delivery in this plan matches the delivery of instruction to be delivered during the 2020-2021 school year,
 - o the District/PSA will re-confirm how instruction will be delivered during the 2020-2021 school year thirty days after ISD approval of the plan, and every 30 days thereafter at a meeting of the Board, and
 - o public comment will be solicited from the parents or legal guardians of the pupils enrolled in the District/PSA during a public meeting described in PA-149.

9. Learning Plan Narrative

Opening Statement

- Please provide a statement indicating why an Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan is necessary to increase pupil engagement and achievement for the 2020-2021 school year.

Our district has been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. This can be categorized as a traumatic event for some. Students may have developed significant gaps in their learning and because of that, equity issues that already existed may now be more pronounced.

As we have now returned to school, one of our priorities will be to ensure the well-being of all members of our school community. Because of the wide range of experiences students had during remote learning in the spring, we anticipate that students will come to school in the fall of 2020 with a wider than usual range of competencies. We expect that many students may be behind and will need opportunities to catch up. Teachers will be instrumental in figuring out how fast or slow they can proceed with their students as they determine what comes next in the learning for each of them.

As Lake Linden-Hubbell begins the school year, we have over 90% of our students here learning in a face to face environment five days a week. The others have chosen one of our three learning options which are synchronous (Lakes Livestream), asynchronous (Lakes Virtual), or completely online. No matter the way our students are receiving their instruction, we will need to ensure that there are structures in place to ensure student engagement and achievement for all. This plan will focus on teaching and learning and the well-being of students and staff.

Quality Evidence-Based Assessment Practices

Lake Linden-Hubbell Public Schools believes that benchmark assessments can be used to monitor and evaluate patterns and trends in school/district academic performance and to identify effective instructional programs. We believe it can provide guidance for standardizing or adjusting curriculum and instruction across all grade levels.

However, we will not use benchmark assessment data to make high-stakes instructional decisions about individual student learning. Rather, we will continue the use of the formative assessment process as the main practice we use in the teaching and learning process to continuously observe where our students are in order to modify instruction.

We believe the use of the formative assessment process, which is supported by research, provides important data for both our teachers and students to accelerate their learning and progress and gives us a more complete picture of what our students know and are able to do.

Educational Goals

Assessments in reading and mathematics (required) will be administered to all students twice: once in the first nine weeks of the school year; and again prior to the last day of school. Formative

assessments will provide information to inform our progress toward our goals over the course of the year. Progress reports will be available on our website in February and June.

Additionally, we will continue to inform stakeholders of the district's balanced assessment system, including publicly sharing aggregate and student subgroup performance reports on Smarter Balanced and DIBELS results.

Goal 1 - All students (K-8) will improve performance in Reading/ELA from Fall to Spring as measured by Smarter Balanced and DIBELS.

- All teachers will use the formative assessment process to support adjustment to teaching & learning, to support meaningful student progress towards mastery of Reading/ELA academic standards.
- Results from Reading/ELA benchmark assessments, local Reading/ELA summative assessments, and formative assessment will be continuously discussed and analyzed by staff.

Goal 2 - All students (K-8) will improve performance in Mathematics from Fall to Spring as measured by Smarter Balanced and DIBELS.

- All teachers will use the formative assessment process to support adjustment to teaching & learning, to support meaningful student progress towards mastery of Math academic standards.
- Results from Math benchmark assessments, local Math summative assessments, and formative assessment will be continuously discussed and analyzed by staff.

Instructional Delivery & Exposure to Core Content

Mode of Instruction

The District is providing face to face instruction in preK-12. It will take place in our buildings 5 days a week on normal school hours.

For those not quite ready to be back in a face to face format, our students in grades preK-5 are able to take instruction through our Lincoln Learning platform and still have interaction with our teaching staff. Those choosing this option can opt back to face to face instruction after a semester. Students in grades 6-12 are also able to be completely online through courses offered through Edgenuity and/or Michigan Virtual. Those choosing this option are also able to opt back to face to face instruction after a semester. Also for students in grades 6-12 we are offering both a

synchronous (classes from our teachers streamed live) or asynchronous (recorded lessons from our teachers that students access at their convenience during the day) option for core classes with the rest of their schedule rounded out with classes from Edgenuity, Odysseyware and/or Michigan Virtual.

Curriculum and Instruction: Academic Standards

The curriculum of the Lake Linden-Hubbell School District for core academic areas is aligned to state standards. The complete online options that students can choose are courses that are aligned with the state standards as well. Their online course content matches what is taught in our regular classroom. Teachers will be making regular weekly contact with each student to instruct and assist as needed.

In the high school, students who choose the synchronous core lessons (Lakes Livestream), are participating in the class as they happen so they are receiving the instruction directly from the teacher as are those students that are taking their core classes asynchronously (Lakes Virtual). These students are also getting the instruction from their regular teacher but instead of a live feed, they are watching recorded lessons and accessing them at their convenience. Therefore, the scope and sequence is the same as face to face because it is the same instructor.

Assessment and Grading

Our District's assessments are based on the Michigan Standards. Students are regularly assessed at the district and classroom level to determine if they are making progress toward meeting those standards. Formative assessment plays a large role in this. It's a critical part in the instructional process so that students receive timely feedback that helps them know what they need to do to improve. It also gives the teachers important information they need in order to know how to adjust the teaching and learning process to meet each student's needs.

We make available to our parents and legal guardians a web-based system (PowerSchool) that allows them to see their children's grades at any time. Our teachers keep up-to-date information on student grades in this system. We also send progress reports to our parents and guardians during each marking period. This is in addition to the expectation we have for all teachers that they keep parents and guardians aware of any concerns regarding a student's grade through emails and/or phone calls. Finally, we send out report cards to parents and legal guardians at the end of each marking period.

Technology

Unlike in the spring when we were forced into remote learning and we relied on getting packets to those that did not have internet access or a device that would allow them to access the information they needed, we are now loaning out chromebooks to those families that are in need and have chosen a non face to face method of instruction. If we get a family that chooses an online option but they do not have internet access, we will work with the family to come up with an agreeable solution as we work to ensure that all students have equitable access to technology and the internet.

When school starts, students' IEPs and 504 plans will be reviewed in coordination with general and special education teachers to address any accommodations and/or services that are needed due to known changes in students' needs.
